**THE ROSE CODE by KATE QUINN, 3/9/21**

1940. As England prepares to fight the Nazis, three very different women answer the call to mysterious country estate Bletchley Park, where the best minds in Britain train to break German military codes

**THE FOUR WINDS by KRISTIN HANNAH, 2/2/21**

Texas, 1934. Millions are out of work and a drought has broken the Great Plains. Farmers are fighting to keep their land and their livelihoods as the crops are failing, the water is drying up, and dust threatens to bury them all.

**PROJECT HAIL MARY by ANDY WEIR, 5/4/21**
